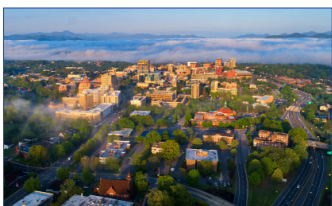


University of Vermont in Burlington, VERMONT
