

TIPS FOR MAKING STUDY ABROAD MORE COST-EFFECTIVE

This handout outlines some of the tips, tricks, and cost considerations to help guide students on a budget through the study abroad process.

COST CONSIDERATIONS

- <u>ISEP Exchange</u> is the most popular type of program at ISEP. With exchange you pay tuition, living expenses, and fees to your home university, including the price of housing as if you were living on campus and the cost of a full meal plan. Almost all federal, state, institutional and outside financial aid will transfer to your program.
- Alternatively, an <u>ISEP Direct</u> program might be more affordable for you depending on your specific needs. For example, ISEP's Study in Ghana program includes tuition, housing, and meals for just \$12,950 (Fall 2022). Federal and state financial aid should apply to Direct programs for U.S. students, but check with your home university for more details.
- Apply for <u>ISEP scholarships</u> and other <u>study abroad scholarships</u>. Students with demonstrated financial need are eligible for ISEP's <u>Community Scholarship</u>. Don't miss out on a great way to fund your study abroad experience by applying to scholarships!



TIPS AND TRICKS

- Find and utilize your resources: talk to your study abroad office about what resources are available to you. Visit ISEP's <u>Budgeting for Study Abroad</u> and <u>Diversity</u>, <u>Inclusion and Accessibility</u> website pages for a comprehensive list of resources for students traveling on a budget.
- Consider the length of time you would like to be away from home. ISEP offers programs as short as two weeks (either over the summer or winter break) to as long as a year and everything in between.
 Staying abroad longer means you take advantage of your initial travel expenses (like the cost of a flight) by maximizing your time abroad.
- Remember to budget for any loss in income for the time you are away. It is unlikely that you will be able to secure a job while abroad.

- Consider the programs you would like to attend. See page 2 for featured affordable ISEP programs.
- Visit ISEP's <u>Country Handbooks</u> to learn more about the cost of living for the countries you're interested in before you choose a program.
- To draft a budget for your stay, research the costs of everyday items in your host country (toiletries, snacks, etc.) and the cost of living. Use trusted online sources and guidebooks.
- Get in touch with ISEP and the study abroad office
 at your university to help you narrow down your
 options and to determine which programs might work
 best for your specific needs. We recommend getting
 started early in order to ensure that you are able to
 find your perfect program.

<u>Study in Bangkok</u> | Thammasat University | Chance of Placement: Fair

Study in the French Alps | Université Savoie Mont Blanc | Chance of Placement: Fair

Study in Eastern Europe | American University in Bulgaria | Chance of Placement: Excellent
